Thinking back to Garrels and Mackenzie, Bryan Gregor, and Jan Veizer, among others, and their work on sedimentary recycling lifetimes, terrestrial deposits have the shortest e-folding time (average lifetimes); thus, no, I don't think it is unreasonable to

assume that 90-99% of the terrestrial carbon stored during the Late Paleocene was subsequently destroyed.
